Held in the Police Control building, Kalimpong, the camp aimed to promote the welfare of furry beings in the region. A total of 37 dogs, including 11 cats underwent sterilisation during this camp.

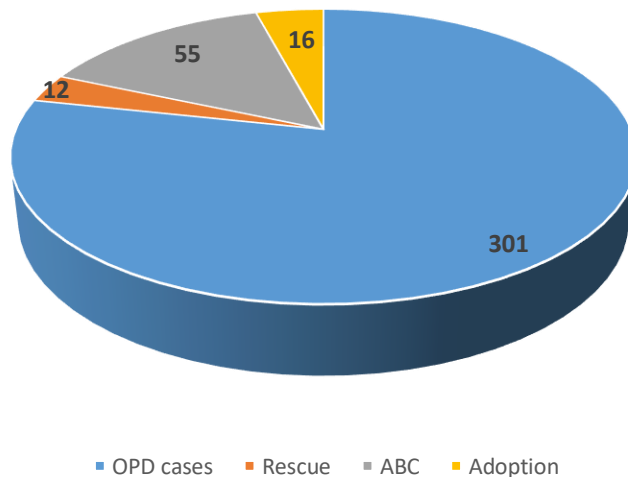
Diwali brought more excitement to the furry family as they received truckloads of food from Pedigree India!
