ANMAL BIRTH CONTROL PROGRAMME

This month, our team successfully conducted ABC procedures on 26 animals under the Dogs Trust project. Additionally, 56 dogs were inoculated against rabies. ABC and ARV are crucial components of our efforts to control the population of stray animals and reduce instances of overpopulation in our area.

TRAINING ACHIEVEMENTS

The DAS team completed their training on Animal Birth Control Surgery at the renowned WVS Hicks International Training Centre. It was a 12-day program held in Goa starting from 15th April to 26th April,2024. The Shelter Vet Dr. Mohit and compounder Reewaj successfully completed the Training Program, and they are now ready to integrate their expertise and experience into our shelter's opertions.

ABC CAMP AT RIMBICK

On 23rd April, the Darjeeling Animal Shelter team organized and conducted an ABC camp at Rimbick in Darjeeling where 48 dogs were sterilized by Dr. Shuvani assisted by the team in April. About 57 dogs also received their vaccination against rabies for the well-being of animals and the community.



These camps are essential in reaching a larger number of animals efficiently, ensuring that more animals receive the necessary procedures to control their population.

RESCUE OPERATIONS



During April, we successfully rescued 19 animals. Our rescue operations are vital in providing immediate care and shelter to animals in distress or need of medical attention. Similarly, ten dogs were returned to their same location after their healing and recovery. The dogs were happy to be released in good shape and live their normal lives, free and happy.

ADOPTIONS




