OPD CASES

The shelter experienced a significant surge in parvovirus cases among dogs, with a total of 369 cases reported. Despite this increase, timely interventions and treatments and supportive care including IV fluids, anti-nausea medications, and antibioticcs have resulted in a fair recovery rate. A dedicated treatment area for dogs affected by parvovirus has been established to manage these cases more effectively. Administering



RESCUE OPERATIONS

The shelter also engaged in multiple rescue operations this month: These rescues involved dogs suffering from road traffic accidents, maggot wounds, and other injuries. Seven of these rescued dogs completed their treatment plans and have been deemed fit for release back into the community. he remaining dogs are still admitted and undergoing treatment at Darjeeling Animal Shelter. They will be released once they have fully recovered.

ANIMAL BIRTH CONTROL PROGRAMME

The Darjeeling Animal Shelter conducted an extensive Sterilisation/Animal Birth Control (ABC) program this month, showcasing the dedication and team spirit of our staff:

Total Dogs Sterilised at the Shelter Facility in May: 40 Total Cats Sterilised at the Shelter facility - 12

Additionally, a Village ABC camp was held on May 19th in Sonada. Dr. Shivani, assisted by compounders, performed sterilisation on 46 dogs. The camp was highly successful, with the team ensuring the full recovery of these dogs post-spaying. Essential advice on post-spaying care and medication was provided to the owners and community caretakers.



ADOPTION PROGRAMME

Following a temporary halt in adoptions due to an outbreak of hemoprotozoan disease, we are pleased to report that our adoption program has resumed. With the improvement and control of viral illnesses among cats and dogs, the shelter successfully facilitated the adoption of:

Kittens Adopted: 3

Puppies Adopted: 3

These animals were dewormed, vaccinated, and declared healthy before being placed into their new homes.
